DRESS CODE

Along with other Clubs around the country Feltwell Golf Club adopts a Dress code for the Golf Course and the Clubhouse and we encourage members, guests and visitors to abide by this Code. It is the responsibility of the members to remind guests and visitors of our Code. There is no hard and fast rule for clubs to follow, it is up to individual clubs to make their own Rules on Acceptable Wear on and off the Course to ensure that the appearance of all who use the club will not offend others.

Acceptable Wear at Feltwell Golf Club on the Course/Practice Area

It is necessary for all players (be they members or non-members) to wear acceptable clothing designed for golf and suitable golf shoes on the course at all times. We are aware that fashions change constantly and we accept that some shirts previously not allowed are now considered to be acceptable golf attire.

- Shirts with sleeves and collars, this includes roll necks and turtle necks and shirts may be worn outside of trousers if designed accordingly. Ladies may wear sleeveless shirts (with a collar).
- Golf 'style' trousers. Ladies may wear Khaki trousers or smart slacks.
- > Tailored shorts to the knee for men. Ladies may wear tailored shorts designed for golf; Ladies may also wear cropped trousers or Skorts.
- Socks for men should be ankle or knee length.
- ➤ Golf shoes should be worn on the course though on the Practice Area (or having for those having lessons with the Professional) it is acceptable to wear smart trainers

Unacceptable Wear on the Course/Practice Area

- > Sports tops with logos (other than Golf Club logos); sleeveless or tee shirts and vests; Ladies sun tops
- Denim trousers; tracksuits

All of the above plus smart casual clothing and jeans

Caps, visors etc; Spiked Golf Shoes – these should be removed on entering the Clubhouse
